Re: Movement of Panels for Recruitment to the Cadre of Assistants

It is already more than one year and eight months since the process of Recruitment to the posts of Assistants got underway on the 17th of September 2019. There was a sense of jubilation all around with the announcement of 8000 vacancies of Assistants after an excruciatingly long wait of almost a decade. Around 5800 Assistants joined LIC after successful completion of the first round of Recruitment process. Naturally, still there are more than 2000 Assistant vacancies in different divisions across the country.

The recruitment process was held up in some divisions because of court cases. We were happy when the list of successful candidates in respect of Vishakhapatnam and Kadapa Divisions under South Central Zone were released recently. Till date, however, the appointment letters have not been issued in these divisions. Similarly, the results have already been declared for candidates in the state of Kerala but the recruitment process has not yet been completed. We understand that except Chennai division, results of all other divisions in the state of Tamilnadu have been declared long back. This being the position, we believe that there are no more legal

hurdles and the decks have been cleared now for LIC to go ahead and complete the Recruitment Process in those divisions.

There is an inexplicably long delay in the movement of the existing panels in Assistant cadre despite the availability of vacancies in all divisions. Since the two-year validity period of the contingency panels is fast coming to an end, this has created considerable anxiety among the candidates. Many of the candidates approaching the upper age limit for recruitment have been desperately staring at an uncertain future. Not filling up of the vacancies has also created considerable burden on the offices impacting the policy servicing.

In the circumstances, we request you to take expeditious steps for movement of the Panels and advise the divisions to resume the pending Recruitment process in the interest of LIC and the candidates.
